



THE NOAA CORPS

Part 2 of 3: HISTORY

In part 1 of this series, I introduced the NOAA Corps and the fact I was unaware of its existence. When I first heard of the NOAA Corps, I was baffled that I had not heard of the service. I was only familiar with the military services and the Public Health Service. As I discovered, there was a reason for its lack of notoriety.

The NOAA Corps has technically only been around since 1970. It was part of the merger of several environmental agencies under the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA). However, the work of the newly formed NOAA was not new. Its predecessor agencies had their own long histories. One of them, the US Coast and Geodetic Survey (USC&GS), had roots going back to 1807 under Thomas Jefferson's Administration. [NOAA History Shea 2012].

The uniformed service under NOAA came from the USC&GS. However, the agency did not start off with uniformed officers. It was formed as a civilian service and remained so through various name changes as is common in Government. That is, until the beginning of WWI.

At the onset of WWI, the military was in desperate need of trained surveyors. The military looked to the USC&GS to fill that need. However, it was problematic to use civilian surveyors in a war zone in that if captured by the enemy they could be considered spies. I gather this was an issue during the Civil War. So, the decision was made to create a dedicated commissioned corps of surveyors to avoid this problem.

The USC&GS Commissioned Corp proved its worth during the Great War and was maintained as a separate non-military, uniformed corps in the event their expertise was required in the future, and it was. The call to serve came again in WWII.

Over 1000 civilian members and more than half of the USC&GS's commissioned officers served in WWII as hydrographers, artillery surveyors, cartographers, army engineers, intelligence officers, and geophysicists in both the European and the Pacific theaters. [History of Coast Survey-NOAA.Gov]. Eleven members lost their lives during the war.

Modern day NOAA Corps officers are still subject to transfer to the armed forces through a Presidential order (33 USC § 3061).

After WWII, the responsibilities of the USC&GS expanded to include conducting oceanographic studies worldwide [https://www.oma.noaa.gov/noaa-corps/our-history]. Thus, the agency transformed from pre-dominantly surveying into a scientific agency. This mission expanded over the years and was ultimately placed under the control of NOAA, along with the corps of officers created at the beginning of WWI.

Although the NOAA Corp's main mission is to support NOAA's scientific work, ships have been utilized for other purposes as the need arose. NOAA ships took part in the Exxon Valdez and Deepwater Horizon oil spill responses as well as nautical surveys post-Gulf War in the Persian Gulf. Survey ships were also assigned to help in several major at-sea aircraft wreckage search operations employing side scan sonar capabilities (TWA Flight 800, John F. Kennedy, Jr's plane, EgyptAir Flight 990)
