

Greeting and Blessing.

This month's article I plan to talk about the difficult topic of Officers suicide. As career retired law enforcement officers, we can make a difference in the life of active officers struggling with the job or other issues in their personal life's. One officer's suicide is way too many, In Deuteronomy 30:11-20, "you can hear the heart of God crying out for his people to choose life"! We are instruments of God's plan to protect his people, as retired officer we can continue to serve and protect those that protect us. As we are all aware, police officer avoids seeking help, in fear of being deemed unfit for duty.

According to the National Alliance on Mental Health, the majority of police officers face alcohol abuse, depression, post-traumatic stress disorder (PTSD), and even suicidal thoughts. While depression and PTSD are more understandable, suicide is what has alarmed most. Citizens often assume that people who work in law enforcement are some of the toughest people in our communities, which can cause the topic of mental health for police officers to be overlooked. Police officers do struggle with mental health and the statistics prove it.



Reported Suicides by Police Officers:

2017 – 184 Suicides	2018 – 191 Suicides	2019 – 250 Suicides	2020 – 190 Suicides
2021– 189 Suicides	2022 – 184 Suicides	2023 – 18 Suicides in the first 6 weeks	

Law Enforcement Officers with prior military experience have the highest rate of suicide among first responders. So, how can we help, the WWW.COPLINE.ORG is a wonder organizational that works to prevent police officer suicide. Retired officer volunteers are trained (40 hours in mental health) to take calls from the hotline to be peer listeners for officers struggling and need someone to talk to anonymously. They only asked that you volunteer (2) 8 hour shifts a month. For those that are looking for something meaning to be involved in, check out the COPLINE organization.



SAFETY TIPS >>>>>>>>



I want to thank everyone for putting their trust and faith in me as the new Safety Officer. I will do the best I can and appreciate the people who have already spoken to me about stepping up as Road Captains. We still need more. You don't need to make a commitment to be at all of the rides. If you can help out at any rides that would be great. Please don't hesitate to speak to me if you're considering it. Thanks.

I would like to reiterate some points I mentioned at the last meeting regarding group riding and safety:

- (1) maintain two second distance from the rider in front of you when in staggered formation especially approaching signal lights to help ensure everyone makes it through the light (this also will help avoid cagers from cutting into our lines);
- (2) use hand signals (see diagram of hand signals below); (3) attend pre-ride briefing so everyone knows route just in case you get separated from the group to know where to rejoin the group.

PURCHASING A COMPUTER 101

If you're in the market for a new desktop or laptop computer, you may be wondering how to know if you're getting a sound machine or a good deal. There are several important factors to consider when buying a computer. These simple tips explain how to find a computer that best fits your needs.

Desktop vs. Laptop

The best way to decide between the two main categories of computers is to determine how and where you will be using yours.

A **desktop** is great if you work primarily from one place, such as a home office. You can often get more for your money with a desktop. You'll likely be able to find a bigger monitor, a faster processor, and more memory, storage, and ports for the same amount of money you'd spend on a laptop. The main advantage of using a **laptop** is portability, but you will often pay a premium for it. Technology is now so advanced that most people can make do with the specs on a lower-end laptop, even on the ones that weigh as little as three pounds or less.

Operating System (OS)

<u>Microsoft's Windows</u> is by far the most widely used operating system. (Recommended: Windows 10 Professional 64bit.). Generally speaking, <u>Macs</u> are considered superior for creative purposes; PCs are preferred for serious gaming. Either will work for what most people need or want to do on a computer. <u>Chromebooks</u> are laptops that run on the simple, speedy and secure Chrome OS designed by Google. But it is significantly different from the other two operating systems. Most of the storage is in the cloud rather than on the laptop itself.

Processor: Almost any recent computer will have a powerful enough processor for anyone who mainly spends time working with documents or spreadsheets and surfing online. On the other hand, if you are working with multiple graphics, video, or other processor-intensive applications, you want a powerful processor and more memory (RAM). Recommended: Intel Core i5 (sixth generation or newer) or equivalent

Memory (RAM): Speaking of RAM... RAM (Random Access Memory) is how computer memory is measured. Basically, it's how your computer gets stuff done. Data resides temporarily on your computer in RAM as you perform different tasks, and the more you do at one time, the more memory is used. 8 megabites (MB) of RAM should be sufficient for normal operations on a Windows or Mac but if you like to keep a lot of tabs open on your browser or use heavy programs as mentioned above, then your computer will work much more quickly with 12MB or even 16MB of RAM. A Chromebook can usually operate just fine on 4MB of RAM.

Storage: Many people confuse memory and storage. The "memory" a lot of people care most about is how much stuff (files, applications, photos, videos, etc.) a computer can save and that's called storage. Except for Chromebooks, which store most files in the cloud, your files and folders will be held on a local drive: a hard disk drive (HDD) or solid-state drive (SSD). SSDs are made with newer technology, run faster, and require less power. HDDs operate slower and are built with older, more mechanical tech, but this makes them more affordable, even for large amounts of storage, so they're a good option for an external backup disk or anyone who needs a laptop on a budget. The amount of storage available is measured in bytes: kilobytes (kb), megabytes (mb), gigabytes (gb) and terabytes (tb). Documents, spreadsheets, and the like don't take up much space where as music, graphics, and video can take up a lot of space. To give you an idea, one terabyte of drive space can hold about 250,000 photos.

Ports and Drives: Most computers, including laptops, have at least one Universal Serial Bus (USB) port. USB is an industry standard that establishes specifications for cables, connectors and protocols for connection, communication and power supply (interfacing) between computers, peripherals and other computers. Desktops have ports to hook up monitors, printers, external drives, and other attachments. Some laptops have ports to hook up external displays, even TVs, Ethernet ports, and more. When buying peripherals, you need to make sure that your computer has an appropriate port for it or that an adapter exists.

Similarly, if you want to be able to play CDs, DVDs, or Blu-ray discs or save anything onto a blank memory disc (hey, some like it retro!), you'll have to make sure the desktop or laptop computer you're looking at has an optical drive. You may also be interested in memory card slots if you use those regularly or have any old ones you'd like to transfer to the cloud.

Network Adaptor: A network adapter is a piece of hardware that acts as the interface for computers and other devices to connect to a network. Recommendation: 11ac 2.4/5 GHz wireless adapter.

Display: The more pixels, the higher the quality image, especially if you work with a great deal of graphics or video. Touchscreens cost more. Recommended: 14" LCD monitor, resolution of 1600 x 900 or better. . .

How Much Should a Computer Cost? Generally speaking, the range is wide with prices starting at around \$300 for basic models with limited storage space and running upwards of \$6,000. Midrange desktop computers best for home offices should land between \$700 and \$1K. And the average cost of a new laptop is \$600–\$700. Buying online is often cheaper than buying in a physical store still, you may want to check out what local stores might be offering. It is not generally considered worth buying the extended warranties those outlets usually try to sell you.

In the end, what you're willing to spend will determine what kind of laptop or desktop computer you can get, but if you take a little time to decide what the must-have features of your new machine are, you'll be able to narrow down from there and figure out which specs or peripherals are just nice-to-haves.


