

#8 Helmets Save Lives


Motorcycle helmet laws in the US are a hot button topic and for good reason as issues such as personal choice & personal responsibility clash against governmental interest & jurisdiction ... the below stats are simply meant to point out the effectiveness of motorcycle helmets in the event of an accident.



Helmets reduce the risk of death by 40% & reduce the risk of brain injury by 69%.

Case Study: Michigan

In 2012 Michigan repealed its universal helmet law requiring all riders to wear helmets. Statistics taken since that change have shown a 23% increase in motorcyclist fatalities!



The NHTSA estimates that helmets saved 1,772 motorcyclists' lives in 2015 and that 740 more could have been saved if all motorcyclists had worn helmets.

BACKUPS! BACKUPS! BACKUPS!

People lose extremely important information due to computer hardware failures, natural or manmade disasters and sometimes from common mistakes. Have some kind of backup regimen in place to safeguard your important files such as financial records, calendars, photographs, videos. And so on.

Do a backup of your DATA FILES on a regular basis. You can back your files up to an external device such as a thumb drive or external hard drive. You do not need to backup the software installed on your computer because the software can be reinstalled from CD's or downloaded from the manufacturer or the cloud. If you are not computer proficient you can purchase software programs that can automate the backup process and there is tons of instructional information on the internet.

The problem with those backups, however, is that they tend to remain on site. That means if something happens to the site — meaning your home or business — both your computer *and* your backups are at risk. So, find an off site location to store the device.

Online services (like Dropbox, OneDrive, Google Drive and other <u>cloud</u> storage providers) provide off-site backup. Another benefit is that anything you put there (into, say, Dropbox) so you can share it with someone else if you choose. There are cloud-based backup programs that focus exclusively on backing up without the additional sharing/storage/online access aspects of more general purpose cloud storage services.


